Strategy Checklist

Equity is imperative in our collaborative efforts to create healthier communities. The challenge (and the opportunity) lies in translating our commitment to equity into daily practice. This strategy checklist outlines eight opportunities for advancing equity through community health improvement efforts. Within each opportunity there are three or four practical strategies you can implement as part of your local efforts. The suggested use is to scan the list, check off any strategies that are already in place, and circle one or more strategies you would like to implement or improve. Also consider sharing the checklist with your team and community partners to engage them in strategic thinking about the possibilities.
